Crime Stoppers



Make an anonymous tip through Crime Stoppers and you may be eligible for a reward of up to \$1,000.

Call Crime Stoppers at (808) 961-8300 island wide. You will be given a code number to track the status of your case. By calling later and giving your code number, you can find out whether you qualify for a reward.

If the Crime Stoppers board of directors selects you for a reward, you will be directed to an agreed-upon location to pick up the money. You will never be required to provide your name. Crime Stoppers doesn't record any calls or subscribe to caller ID.

Crime Stoppers is a volunteer program run by ordinary citizens who want to keep their community safe.





Media Release

With the Fourth of July approaching, Hawai'i County Animal Control Services is offering pet safety tips for Hawai'i Island pet owners.

July 4th Pet Safety Tips:

- Keep your pet secured inside. Pets tied up outside can panic due to the loud noise and may break their tie-out or jump over a fence to escape the noise.
- Make sure your pet is microchipped and the current owner information is updated, to help increase the chances of reunification. Go to my24pet.com to register your pet's microchip.
- Thunder shirts, favorite treats, and crating, are all ways to help keep your pet calm. Check with your veterinarian about anxiety medications for your dog.





- · People who find healthy stray animals are encouraged to have the animal scanned for a microchip by a County of Hawai'i Animal Control Officer, at a veterinarian's office, or by a local rescue group. If a found animal is microchipped, veterinarians can try to find its owner by searching for microchip on my24pet.com.
- People who find a healthy stray animal or who lose a pet are encouraged to post it as lost / found on https://lost.petcolove.org/. Petco Love Lost is a searchable national database that uses patented facial recognition technology to make finding lost pets quicker and easier.

This simple-to-use tool will be easily accessible to participating animal organizations nationwide, as well as any pet parent or person who finds a lost pet. Uploaded photos of a missing dog or cat are immediately scanned to determine whether the lost pet is at a participating shelter or with a neighbor in the community.

There are a handful of organizations across the island using this technology, including Hawai'i County Animal Control and Protection Agency, Hawai'i Animal Kuleana Alliance, and Hawai'i Island Humane Society.

Hawai'i County Animal Control asks the public to please kokua this July Fourth by following the rules regarding fireworks to reduce the risk of injuries to people and pets alike.

As a reminder, as of July 1, 2023, Hawai'i County Animal Control Services will transition to become the Animal Control and Protection Agency, and will no longer be under the management of the police department.

Earlier this year, Hawai'i County Council passed Bill 22, creating a new Animal Control and Protection Agency, which will fall under the Office of Management (Mayor's Office.)

Hawai'i Police Department wants to assure the public that animal control services will continue in much the same way while it transitions to a new agency.

The phone numbers for animal control services will remain the same with (808) 327-3558 serving as the phone number for lost pets and non-emergencies. For animal emergencies, such as injured animals, any animal that is a public safety risk, animal cruelty, and situations in which an animal's owner has been arrested or died with no family to pick up the animal, people can continue to call the Police Dispatch number at (808) 935-3311.

If people come across a deceased animal on a county road please call the Department of Public Works Highways Division at (808) 961-8349. If the deceased animal is on a state Highway or road, please call the State Department of Transportation Highways Division at (808) 933-8866.





Fireworks Control Law

§132D-3 Permissible uses of consumer fireworks. Consumer fireworks may be set off, ignited, discharged, or otherwise caused to explode within the State only:

- (1) From 9:00 p.m. on New Year's Eve to 1:00 a.m. on New Year's Day; from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Chinese New Year's Day; and from 1:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on the Fourth of July; or
- (2) From 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. as allowed by permit pursuant to section 132D-10 if the proposed cultural use is to occur at any time other than during the periods prescribed in paragraph (1); provided that the purchase of not more than five thousand individual consumer fireworks commonly known as firecrackers shall be allowed under each permit. [L 1994, c 180, pt of §1; am L 2000, c 233, §5; am L 2006, c 183, §4]

§132D-4 Permissible uses of display fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, and aerial devices. (a) Display fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, and aerial devices may be purchased, set off, ignited, or otherwise caused to explode in the State only if for display and permitted in writing pursuant to sections 132D-10 and 132D-16.

(b) Display fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, and aerial devices shall be set off, ignited, discharged, or otherwise caused to explode within the State only from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.; provided that the applicable county fire chief may extend the time period for special events; provided further that the time restriction established in this subsection shall not apply to display fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, and aerial devices set off, ignited, discharged, or otherwise caused to explode within the State solely as part of a movie or television production. [L 1994, c 180, pt of §1; am L 2000, c 233, §6; am L 2006, c 183, §5; am L 2011, c 127, §3]

§132D-7 License or permit required. A person shall not:

- (1) Import, store, offer to sell, or sell, at wholesale or retail, aerial devices, display fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, or consumer fireworks unless the person has a valid license issued by the county; or
- (2) Possess aerial devices, display fireworks, or articles pyrotechnic without a valid license to import, store, or sell aerial devices, display fireworks, or articles pyrotechnic, or a valid display permit as provided for in this chapter. [L 1994, c 180, pt of §1; am L 2000, c 233, §7; am L 2006, c 183, §7]
